Please remember if you are claiming the 15 hours for 2 year olds, or extended 30 hours for 3-4 year olds **YOU MUST** re-confirm eligibility **TERMLY** and have a valid code before the end of the month before a new term starts.

If you think you may be eligible for this in the **next term** please go onto the <u>childcare choices</u> website which explains all you need to know [the site has lots of other information about other forms of funding options too]. Again you **MUST** confirm eligibility and get your code before the start of a new term.

Recommended dates to apply for Spring Term - 15th Oct-30thNov/ Autumn term between 15th June-31st July/ Summer term 15th Jan-28th Feb.

Sessions can fill up, especially with new children joining us, if you are thinking of increasing your sessions, adding extra sessions or extending to full days - please speak to us as soon as possible to check availability, —we book a term in advance. Summer term is usually our busiest.
